Research & Note-taking on Storyboard*	10 points Storyboard indicates accurate research & planning from over 5 varied information sources on 15 slides	8-9 points Storyboard is filled out with important points from several sources on a minimum of 12 slides	0-7 points Information from 2 or less information sources which are very similar. Storyboard is incomplete and less than 12 slides in presentation
Introduction* (Slide 2)	3 points Gives overall topic and draws in the audience.	2 points Introduction relates to the topic and is clear.	0-1 point Introduction does not giving a brief overview to the subject.
Content (Slides 1-15)	10 points Complete sentences are not used. Writing is clear and concise with logical organization and progression. Information is accurate and current	9 points Complete sentences are used very rarely. Content is written with logical progression of ideas and supporting information.	0-8 points Complete sentences are used frequently. Content is not clear, nor logical in progression. Few facts, with information that is incomplete, out-of-date or incorrect.
Text Elements*	6 points No more than 2 fonts are used. Text does not overwhelm the slide. Background is the same throughout	5 points Most fonts are easy to read, but on occasion, font style, italics, long paragraphs, color or busy backgrounds detract from readability.	0-4 points Busy background, lack of use of bullets/indents, poor color contrasting, more than 2 font styles used.
Graphics, Sound and/or Animations*	8 points Assist in the presentation, help enhance understanding of the ideas. No cross-overs of graphics and text.	6-7 points Visually depict topic and assist audience, images are proper size & resolution. Images/text do not cross over.	0-5 points Unrelated to content, Animations cross over each other. Distracting, busy, and detract from presentation.
Writing Mechanics	6 points The text is written with no errors in grammar, capitalization, punctuation, and spelling.	4-5 points The text clearly written with little or no editing required for grammar, punctuation, and spelling.	0-3 points Errors in spelling, capitalization, punctuation, and grammar repeatedly occur with editing and revision required.(more than 5 errors)
Works Cited (Slide 15)	7 points A minimum of 5 sources from numerous resources are noted on the last slide.	6 points Most sources are noted. There are a minimum of 3 used.	0-5 points Two or less sources are listed with there being little difference between types of resources.
